Coming Home?

With the coming of September, cooler weather, and conclusion of summer get-aways, we naturally come back to the rhythms of everyday life. School begins, fall and winter preparations begin, pull fall clothes out from the back of the closet to be worn, and other things as well.

One of the traditions / habits is the return for many of coming home back to church. The Roxbury Church is unique as it has been reported to have that family, caring feeling among those who attend. (We have our uneasy moments to be sure as well, but what family doesn't?)

It is hoped that you would consider getting in the habit, like some, to purchase your cards on a monthly basis

We would like to have the second Sunday of each Month be Card Ordering Sunday. We would like to have a set day so it is easy to remember to order and easy for the processing... Next Date: September 8

The concept is simple.

- You buy the card at the face value (ex. \$100) and we purchase a cash card from the store.
- They charge approx. 5% less and the church keeps the difference.
- You spend the same amount, but by using the card, your Church gets a 5% benefit!!

We work primarily with Stop & Shop, Big Y and Shop Rite cards

Do You Have A Will and Have You Considered Naming the Roxbury Church In It?



A Will gives instructions to your survivors on how to distribute your estate after your death. Your estate is everything you own. Cars, house and other real property, cash stocks, golf clubs, computers, jewelry, and other personal property all constitute your estate. The total often is greater than we imagine, but a Will

is necessary and important regardless of the size of the estate. Without a Will, the distribution of your property will be dictated by the laws of your state.

How Can I include the Roxbury Church?

Specific amount: State a specific dollar amount (but make sure you review your Will regularly). Gift by percentage: Give a percentage of a particular asset, or a percentage of your estate. Residual bequest: Give the remainder of your estate after your survivors have received their inheritance.

Bequests help to provide principal investments from which interest and growth are used to supplement the Church's Operating and Mission Budget.

While it is suggested that you consult an estate attorney to draw up a will, there are free will websites including https://www.freewill.com
